
Fall Fundraiser - Mumkins

SCRIP is a program that allows families to save for school with daily purchases. Over the last 10 years our families have saved over \$300,000 in tuition and it just got easier. You can now use Credit Cards to pay for your SCRIP cards! Physical gift cards are available every full week of school, they are ordered on Monday and delivered to your students backpack on Friday morning of the same week. For example the first order week is August 26 the cards will be delivered on Friday, August 30. SCRIP NOW and Reload cards are available all the time regardless of the full week of school. Questions?
